Keynote Speaker

Martha S. Bradley-Evans, Ph.D.

Dean of Undergraduate Studies
University of Utah*

Dr. Bradley-Evans is a professor in the College of Architecture + Planning who teaches history and theory classes. Dr. Bradley-Evans served as the Dean of the Honors College for nine years and as the Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs and Dean of Undergraduate Studies for ten. An award-winning teacher, Bradley-Evans is the recipient of the University of Utah Distinguished Teaching Award, the University Professorship, the Student Choice for Excellence in Teaching Award, and the Bennion Center Service Learning Professorship among others. In 2008, she received the Honorary American Institute of Architects (AIA) Award from the American Institute of Architects Utah.

Her books include: *Kidnapped from that Land: The Government Raids on the Short Creek Polygamists*; *The Four Zinas: Mothers and Daughters on the Frontier*; *Pedastals and Podiums: Utah Women, Religious Authority and Equal Rights*; and *An Architectural Travel Guidebook to Utah*.

Dr. Bradley-Evans received the Rosenblatt Prize in 2020, the highest honor awarded to a faculty member of the University of Utah.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AND UNIVERSITY AWARDS

Outstanding Faculty Research and Scholarship Award

Rob O'Neill, Ph.D.

Dr. Rob O'Neill is a Professor in the Department of Special Education and is a national Board Certified Behavior Analyst-Doctoral Level and a licensed behavior analyst in the state of Utah. He has previously served as the Chair, and the coordinator of both the Program in Severe Disabilities and the Program in Mild/Moderate Disabilities in his Department. Dr. O'Neill established the College's BCBA training program beginning in 2010. Dr. O'Neill's research focuses on strategies for supporting persons exhibiting severe challenging behaviors in a variety of community settings, including homes, classrooms, and work

sites. His current work is concerned with the areas of functional assessment, teaching communication skills as alternatives to problem behaviors, and school-wide behavioral support. Dr. O'Neill has received over a million and a half dollars in federal grant support for his research, development, and personnel preparation activities. He has published a number of journal articles, books, and book chapters, and has done presentations at a variety of state, national, and international conferences. His work has appeared in a variety of widely read journals in the fields of special education, applied behavior analysis, and school psychology.

Outstanding Early Career Faculty Research and Scholarship Award

Lauren Barth-Cohen, Ph.D.

Lauren Barth-Cohen, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor of Science Education in the Department of Educational Psychology. She also holds an Adjunct Assistant Professor position in the Department of Physics & Astronomy. Her expertise is in Science Education and her research focuses on student and teacher learning in the physical sciences. Her publications include articles in journals such as,

Cognition and Instruction, Science Education, Computers and Education, Journal of Science Education and Technology, and The Science Teacher. Her research has been funded by the National Science Foundation. Dr. Barth-Cohen holds a BA in Physics from Smith College and a Ph.D. of Science and Math Education from the University of California, Berkeley.

Outstanding Faculty Teaching Award

Maggie Crockett, Ph.D.

Maggie Crockett is a Career-line Professor in the Special Education Department. Dr. Crockett teaches special education courses in the Teacher Education Core, the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) program, as well as the certification program for teachers of students with severe disabilities. She also advises graduate students in both the Severe Disabilities certification area and the BCBA program. She has provided student teacher supervision for pre-service teachers of students with severe disabilities for both on-campus and distance education students and

fieldwork supervision for students in the BCBA program. In addition, she has worked as a classroom teacher for elementary-age students with significant disabilities and as an assistant specialist in a residential program for young adults with significant disabilities. In 2019, she went back to graduate school and graduated in 2021 from the University of Utah with a Master's Degree in Speech Language Pathology. In addition to her work at the University of Utah, she is employed part time as a speech therapist for students with extensive support needs at Kauri Sue Hamilton School.

Outstanding Early Career Faculty Teaching Award

Alexander Hyres, Ph.D.

Alexander Hyres, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor in the history of US education in the Education, Culture, and Society Department. He is also a research affiliate of the Teachers in the Movement Oral History Project at the University of Virginia. He teaches courses on the history of education, social movements, organizing and

activism, multicultural education, and race, space, and educational inequality. He studies the history of Black education, teacher and student activism, curriculum and pedagogy, and the American high school. He recently published "*The Whole Mess is American History*": Protest, Pedagogy, and Black Studies at a

Desegregated High School in the South, 1967-1974," and is organizing a conference with Dara Walker and Jon Hale, supported by the Spencer Foundation, "The

Voices of Student Activists Who Moved A Nation," for the fall of 2022.

Outstanding Faculty Service Award

Breda O'Keeffe, Ph.D.

Breda O'Keeffe, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor and Program Area Coordinator for the Mild/Moderate Disabilities Program in the Department of Special Education. She started in education as a paraprofessional, gained her teaching credential in California, and taught for six years in California and Wisconsin. She completed her doctoral degree at Utah State University and an Institute for Education Sciences postdoctoral fellowship at the University of Connecticut. She serves as the department Admissions Committee Chair, co-chair for the Grow Your Own Educator partnership, member of the College of Education Executive Council, treasurer for the Division of Learning Disabilities of the Council for Exceptional

Children, editorial board member and guest reviewer for national journals, and mentor for a junior faculty through the IES Postdoctoral Fellow Training Program. Her primary research interests include evidence-based practices in assessment, positive behavior supports, and reading instruction for diverse elementary students, including multilingual learners, and at-risk for and with disabilities. O'Keeffe is also interested in the interaction between behavior and literacy. She teaches courses on systems change, educational assessment for students with and without disabilities, and effective methods for literacy instruction and behavior supports in special education and multi-tiered systems of support.

Outstanding Early Career Faculty Service Award

Cynthia Benally, Ph.D.

Dr. Cynthia Benally is Diné, otherwise known as Navajo. She is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Education, Culture & Society. Her work and research focus on two strands: how Native communities navigate and negotiate educational policies as sites of practice for sovereignty and educational self-determination, and how educational policies and laws that mandate Native curriculum and instruction can

be utilized to positively impact non-Native students and communities. Previously, she was an instructor at the Center for Diné Teacher Education at Diné College, a tribal college. She is a former elementary school teacher in urban and Native schools and is a Nationally Board Certified Teacher as a Middle Childhood Generalist.

Outstanding Social Justice and Transformation Award

Leticia Alvarez Gutiérrez, Ph.D.

Dr. Leticia Alvarez Gutiérrez is a first-generation, Purépecha Xicana and Associate Professor in the Department of Education, Culture & Society. Dr. Alvarez Gutiérrez is committed to engaged scholarship conducted in collaboration with youth, educators and communities. She grew up in a working-poor, mixed-status, immigrant household along the San Diego-Tijuana border. She attended school in both the US and México and entered school in the US as a monolingual Spanish speaker. These experiences have shaped her research agenda, which includes highlighting and dismantling educational inequities for BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) students and families. Dr. Leticia Alvarez Gutiérrez is faculty advisor to the Mestizo Arts and Activism Collective which engages BIYOC (Black Indigenous Youth of Color) with critical

participatory action research projects that involve the arts. She founded The Family School Partnership, is a member of the Community Research Collaborative, and Salt Lake Education Collective and serves on the Racial & Ethnic Disparities Advisory Committee with the Utah Board of Juvenile Justice. Her research has appeared in multiple peer review journals and books, including *AERA Open*, *Cultural Geographies*, *Gender & Education* and *The Urban Review*. Leticia is dedicated to educational equity and increasing educators' skills for teaching multilingual learners for pre-and in-service educators.
